CELEBRATE THE LEGEND AND LORE OF PUNXSUTAWNEY'S HERITAGE

Punxsutawney's Groundhog legend pre-dates the area's first German settlers. The first inhabitants of the area, the Delaware Native Americans, shared in the Punxsutawney "Groundhog" roots with their own Native American version of "legend and lore."

According to their legend, the Wojak, which was carried over to us as "Woodchuck", came to be recognized as the "grandfather" of the earliest known inhabitants of this area.
